Asya was awarded several times for her theatre performances. After the breakout of war in Bosnia and Herzegovina, she moved to Canada with her family. They started new life in Vancouver, British Columbia, where Asya joined "Carousel Theatre", as an associate director. She also continued acting on film and TV, and won Year 2000 Leo Award for Best Female Performance in British Columbia, Canada, for the role of Sayma in "My Father's Angel".

She taught acting, voice and movement at the New Image College of Fine Arts, in Vancouver.
